Students, particularly in Developmental Kindergarten through Fourth grade, learn by doing. Singing, playing instruments, moving to music, dancing, and creating music, enable them to acquire skills and knowledge that can be developed in no other way. Learning to read and notate music gives them a skill with which to explore music independently and with others. Listening to, moving and interpreting music and dance, are important building blocks of creative learning. Further, to participate fully in a diverse, global society, students must understand their own historical and cultural heritage and those of others in their communities and beyond. Because music and dance are basic expression of human culture, every student in the Iron Mountain Public School System has access to a balanced, comprehensive, and sequential program of music, and dance study.
