The courses listed below have a specific ELO component and are optional and do not generate grade or course completion. The ELO's are offered and available to all students (full time, part-time, homeschool, traditional IMPS public students and nonpublic/shared time students) at the Homeschool Partnership located at 800 East E Street.

As a Middle School student, we are excited to offer your child additional learning opportunities:

- · Fulfill our high school requirements with a passing grade in both Health 8 and Physical Education 8, each one term
- · Experience a rotation of Music, Technology
- · Select an additional full year class elective
- · Enroll in Math, English, Social Studies, and Science for the full year CORE TRADITIONAL AND VIRTUAL ONLINE (OL)

Below is a brief course description of our middle school tech classes:

<u>Computers 7</u>: (7th gr; semester course) During this course, students will be introduced to the basics of Google Workspace's Productivity Tools (Drive, Chrome, Keep, Mail, Docs, Sheets, Slides, and Forms). The focus will be on selecting the best tool for the job, whether you are writing stories, creating presentations, designing a newsletter, researching, graphing data, and more. This class will also help you to be more organized and prepared for other courses at IMPS.

STEM 7: (7th gr; semester course) The STEM acronym stands for science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. All of these academic disciplines rely heavily on each other, and are highly integrated in the professional and academic world. In this class, students will be introduced to the Engineering Design Process through a variety of challenges that cover areas in astronomy, biology, anthropology, forensics, mathematics, medicine, 3D modeling and much more. All activities include potential career options for students to consider. This is a hands-on, project-based course so come ready to explore, be creative, collaborate with peers, and find solutions to challenging problems.

<u>Computers 8</u>: (8th gr; full year) This class is an introductory computer science course in which students look outward and explore the impact of computer science on society. It covers topics such as problem solving, programming, and physical computing, while inspiring students as they build their own websites, apps, animations, games, and physical computing systems. Students will see how a user-centered design process produces a better application, how data is used to address problems that affect large

numbers of people, and how physical computing with circuit boards allows computers to collect input and return output in a variety of ways.

MS ELECTIVE COURSES STEM 7/8: (7TH GR & 8TH GR)

The study of statistics and probability will give students the graphical and numerical techniques they need to analyze data. These include counting techniques, the use of histograms and tables to study patterns, and probability models. These techniques will allow students to make predictions about real world situations that involve chance and make sound decisions based on analysis of data presented in polls and surveys. In this nine-week class, students will use sampling and bias. They will use counting techniques to determine outcomes. They will find permutations and combinations. They will determine the probability of compound events. Students will use probability distributions to determine values. Finally, students will use simulation techniques to determine probability. The CCSS covered are as follows: The class will be focusing on the Statistics and Probability (SP) Domain of both 7th and 8th grade math courses. Probability describes the likelihood of an event occurring. Statistics can be used to draw conclusions about a population.

NEWSELA "WORDS FOR THE WORLD AROUND US": (7TH GR & 8TH GR) Class will target SEL regarding motivation, engagement, and learning. Literacy is learned through news content. Reading and writing skills for middle school students is enhanced. A variety of articles to be read include arts, health, law, money, sports, science; with the students' responding in written work.

*BELOW ARE FULL YEAR CLASS ELECTIVES TO SELECT ON THE PROVIDED SCHEDULING REQUEST:

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<u>Pre-Algebra 8/Algebra 1:</u> Students will be placed in the appropriate math class as determined by several indicators including: Algebra Prognosis Test, 7th grade math grades, teacher input, student work ethic and state math scores. Algebra counts as a high school credit, but the student's grade is only transferred as pass or fail. See Mr. Johnson or Mr. Herman for more information. Applies only to current 7th graders.

<u>Resource room:</u> Students who qualify for services will work with Mrs. Herman for support in their general education classes.

MS Band: Students will continue to develop the fundamental skills they have learned on their respective instruments in beginning band. However, focus will shift from individual skills and method books to playing music as a group. Which means... more sheet music! More fun! Students will explore a variety of musical styles including classical, contemporary band music, pop/rock, jazz, and music from other cultures. Students will put on 1-2 concerts, and may have other performance opportunities as well. Middle school band is open to anyone with prior musical experience, and those without musical experience if they have the director's approval in advance.

<u>Chorus</u>: This class is open to everyone... and ANYONE can join, regardless of ability! We will sing and perform a variety of music ranging from the classics, to pop, rock, jazz and everything in between. By joining the chorus family you will become a member of a close knit group that will have many opportunities to both perform and travel to watch productions.
