IMHS WRESTLING TEAM INVITED TO TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL STATES

The IMHS Varsity Wrestling Team has had a wonderful season, and they're not done yet!

After being named Mid-Peninsula Conference Champions at home on February 5, the Mountaineers won Team District Finals in Gwinn, MI at Gwinn High School on February 10. IMHS beat Westwood 54-24 and then beat Ishpeming 48-18. On February 12 at Ishpeming High School, the team had 10 individuals place to compete in Individual Regionals.

The team then went onto Team Regionals in Charlevoix, MI where they took home the Regional trophy on February 16 and nine wrestlers were invited to Individual State Quarterfinals, Semi-Finals, and Finals at Ford Field on March 4-5. The team unfortunately lost in Team State Quarterfinals against New Lothrop High School 36-35 on February 25.

The individuals who placed in Regionals will head to States Thursday morning to compete Friday and Saturday March 4 and 5 in Individual State Quarterfinals, Semifinals, and Finals.


WINTER FORMAL

As part of the publishing process, students in early kindergarten planned, wrote and illustrated their own books using a free publishing kit provided by Studentreasures Publishing. The topic of their books was things we love.

The students of Beth Hart's class have been working hard on their books for three weeks. The idea for their Book of Love book started when they were discussing kindness and caring about people, places, and things that are important to them.

"The students showed how compassionate they are at this young age," said Hart.
"Talking about and recognizing things we love and care about will carry over to spreading kindness, love, and respect to people and places around them in hopes of this becoming lifelong habits."

The Studentreasures publishing program provides teachers an easy way to incorporate any lesson plan — from math and science to history, art, and more — into a fun and memorable activity.

Publishing a book in the classroom engages students through hands-on learning and inspires a love of reading and writing, she said.

The best part? A classroom full of proud, smiling young authors, with a memory that lasts a lifetime, plus, a full-color, deluxe hardcover book for the teacher or school library, Hart added.

The students' parents also had an option to purchase copies of these unique, childhood keepsakes.
