## SCHOOL POLICY GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT BALANCES

Effective July 19, 2022

The Iron Mountain Public Schools Food Nutrition Program is committed to providing well-balanced meals that contribute to the health and well-being of our students. We believe nutrition influences a student's development, lifelong health, and potential for learning. We provide breakfast (Elementary \$2.00, MS/HS \$2.25, Reduced Price \$0.30) and lunch (Elementary \$3.00, MS/HS \$3.50, Reduced Price \$0.40) for all students at Iron Mountain Public Schools. The program is managed in accordance with National School Lunch Program.

### Student Balances

Outstanding meal balances are expected to be paid within 2 business days after email notification (parents must opt in to email notifications when they return enrollment forms each school year) have been sent. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to monitor their student's meal activity including account balances, notifications are sent by email for all students once a negative balance has been reached. Notices will also be emailed once students reach the balance of \$5.00 as a reminder of balances getting low. If you do not have access to the internet, please contact our office so we can make notification arrangements. A student's meal account statement will be provided to parents/guardians only when a written request is sent to: Food and Nutrition Director, 217 Izzo Mariucci Way, Iron Mountain, MI 49801.

When a student's account reaches a **zero balance**, students will still be served the regular meal.

Students with a **negative balance** will receive an alternative lunch, but will not be allowed to have breakfast, or any ala carte items. **An alternative lunch of a peanut butter & jelly sandwich or cheese sandwich with fruit, vegetable, and milk will be provided.** This alternative meal will be offered until the account is paid in full or it exceeds 5 days (Elementary \$15.00 and Middle School & High School \$17.50). At this point he/she will no longer have the program available to them until the account is in good standing. Attempts will be made to contact the parents/guardians by phone along with the email notifications. Federal regulations allow the Food Nutrition Program administrators to deny meals to paying students (full-price or reduced) who are in the negative from previous meals.

Please contact Wanda Sherman, Food Service Director 906-779-7735 to make payment arrangements. If your income has changed, your child/children may qualify for free/reduced meals. Paper applications are still available at any of the school offices.
