PROPOSAL SECTION **COUNTY PROPOSALS** E-911 MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall the voters of Dickinson County be assessed 0.40 mill (\$.40 per \$1,000.00 of Taxable Value) over and above the rate of taxation now in effect, to be levied for a period of three years, 2016 to 2018 inclusive, for the purpose of operating and equipping an Enhanced 911 system in Dickinson County and for no other purpose? The estimated amount of revenue that will be collected if approved and levied in the first calendar year is approximately \$397,600. This is a renewal.

PROPERTY TAX LIMITATIONS

Shall separate tax limitations be established for Five (5) years, 2016 thru 2020, inclusive, or until altered by the voters of the county. for the County of Dickinson and the Townships and Intermediate School Districts within the county, the aggregate of which shall not exceed 8.50 mills as follows:

RENEWAL OF DICKINSON-IRON DISTRICT HEALTH DEPARTMENT **MILLAGE**

Shall the limitations of the amount of taxes which may be imposed on taxable property in the County of Dickinson, State of Michigan, be increased by .42 of one mill per one thousand dollars of taxable value, which is forty-two cents (\$.42) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of taxable value for a period of four (4) years, 2017 to 2020 inclusive, for the operations of the Dickinson-Iron District Health Department? It is estimated that the .42 mill would raise approximately \$414,186.00 when first levied in 2017. This is a renewal.

DICKINSON COUNTY ROAD MILLAGE REQUEST

Shall the voters of Dickinson County be assessed 0.5 mill (\$.50 per \$1,000 of Taxable Value) over and above the rate of taxation now in effect, to be levied for a period of (5) years from 2017 to 2021 inclusive, for the purpose of operations, maintenance, and improvements to the public roads of Dickinson County and the city streets in cities of Iron Mountain, Kingsford, and Norway within Dickinson County, and for no other purpose? The estimated amount of revenue that will be collected if approved and levied in the first calendar year is approximately \$500,083. These funds will be distributed among the Road Commission and Cities. This is a

INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSALS SPECIAL EDUCATION MILLAGE PROPOSAL

This proposal will increase the levy by the intermediate school district of special education millage previously approved by electors.

Shall the .9826 mill limitation (\$.09826 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the annual property tax previously approved by the electors of Dickinson-Iron Intermediate School District, Michigan, for the education of students with disability be increased by .5 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 10 years, 2016 to 2025, inclusive; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2016 is approximately \$744,436 from local property taxes authorized therein?
