PROCESS FOR APPLYING FOR SUMMER SCHOOL CLASSES

Step #1: Read all Summer School forms for information regarding Iron Mountain School District's Credit Recovery eligibility and guidelines. Completely fill out the student registration form, including **ALL** required signatures.

Step #2: Submit completed registration forms to your counselor or administrator for approval. Counselor/administrator signature **MUST** be present to register for a credit recovery class.

Step #3: (For online credit recovery) The Summer School administrator and/or counselor will then assign you credentials to log into your online class.

***Note: Registration forms will not be accepted if you are not prepared to make payment at the time you submit your registration form.**

Registration is NOT complete without a completed/signed form.

***Note: Not all courses found within the course catalog are available to students at Iron Mountain High School. Certain restrictions apply. To be sure you are enrolling in the correct course please see your counselor or school principal**

Who can participate?

Any student who attends the School District of Iron Mountain may enroll in our summer school program at no charge if they are enrolled in credit recovery. Students who have failed one or more of the classes offered in our summer credit recovery (CR) program may register. Please call the high school office at 906-779-2610 for more information.

Grade Level:

Any students entering 9th - 12th grade can register for summer school. 12th grade students who did not participate in graduation are highly encouraged to register for summer school to meet graduation requirements.

Course Availability:

Courses are filled on a first come, first served basis, so it is important for families to take note of deadlines and instructions. There are a limited number of seats depending on staff availability.

Class Size and Cancellations:

We will try to keep class sizes to 30 students or less per class. If after you register for a class, or at any time during the program your student cancels the course please advise the high school office at 906-779-2610.

Reporting Absences:

Front office personnel will be on duty during summer school. Please call the high school front office and notify staff of any absences. Leave a message on the attendance line should a secretary not be present at the time you call. **(Please refer to the absences and tardies section for attendance requirements).**

Transportation:

There is transportation available for high school students during summer school. Details will be provided closer to the start of summer school.

Health Condition:

If your child has a health condition that we need to be aware of, especially if it could be potentially life threatening condition, please indicate this on the registration form so we can be prepared for their needs.

Behavior Communication Plan:

Summer School is a time for students to extend their learning. Negative behaviors disrupt the learning environment for all students. We expect that all students follow behavior guidelines established by the school and classroom. Our goal is to do all we can to work with students; unfortunately we may need to dismiss a student due to significant and/or on-going inappropriate behaviors. Below is a general guideline for the Summer School Behavior Communication Plan.

- 1) If a student is disruptive to the classroom setting a contact will be made to inform adults at home of the disruption and ask for assistance.
- 2) If student behavior does not change, a second call will be made to inform adults at home of the continued disruption, by the building principal or summer school supervisor.
- 3) If student behavior still does not change, the student may be dismissed from the Summer School class.

Times & Sessions:

Summer School will run from June 8th - July 29.

Summer School sessions run Tuesday through Thursday from 8:00 am - 10:20 pm. Block 1 will run from 8:00 am - 9:00 am. Students will then have a 20 minute break. Block 2 will run from 9:20 am - 10:20 am.

Exams and Grading:

All exams must be taken at summer school in a supervised environment. For a credit recovery student, after successful completion of a course (passing grade), the student will earn CR (credit) on their transcript and be awarded credit for the course. The CR does not replace the original grade of "F" when the course was taken the first time and failed.

GPA:

Summer school credit recovery courses will not count towards a student's GPA since a grade of an "F" has already been earned on reflected on the students GPA/Transcript.

Fees:

Credit Recovery classes are free.

Registration:

Registration forms must be turned in to the high school front office staff by May 26, 2021. Incomplete registration forms will not be considered. After May 26st, sections of classes will be determined and students will be assigned to a room supervisor and classroom.

Room and Teacher Assignments:

On the first day of class students will be notified as to their classroom number and classroom supervisor.

Absences & Tardies:

Because of the compact and accelerated nature of the summer school program, all credit recovery students must be in attendance every day.

Students are only allowed three (3) absences from the Summer school program. Any more than three (3) absences will result in the student being dismissed from the program and credit will not be earned.

Three (3) tardies will equal one (1) absence. If a student is more than 10 minutes late for class, either before class starts, or returning from a break, the student will be considered absent. If a student leaves class early they will be considered absent, unless permission has been granted by the supervisor.

Technology:

Students are welcome to bring their own devices from home. Please be advised the school is not responsible

for personal devices whether they are lost, stolen, or damaged. If a student wishes to use a school device, Chromebooks will be available for students to check out and use during the summer school session. Students who use a school device **will not** be allowed to take home this device. Students who do not return a school device at the end of the day, may be charged an additional fee. Any device assigned to a student that is lost, stolen, or damaged will result in the students parents being invoiced for repair or replacement.

Dress:

Appropriate school dress is required. Student dress judged inappropriate by the supervisor will receive a warning. Second offenses will result in the student being asked to leave and will result in an absence.

Policy/Rules:

The same academic atmosphere will prevail during summer school as in the regular school year. Please refer to the Iron Mountain High School Parent/Student handbook should you have any questions or contact the high school front office personnel. Disciplinary problems will not be tolerated, and the student will be dismissed from summer school. Students are not permitted to leave campus during summer school hours. All school rules are in effect during summer school. Established policies regarding conduct, care of school property, and dress will be maintained throughout summer school.
